Incidents of a public interest from the last week:-

COUGHTON

- *Theft. Coughton. Secure compound entered. A caravan at the location has then also been broken into and various items stolen including two televisions, light switches, cushion covers and parts of the shower system. Between 16th July and 21st August. 0357 21/08/2021

- *Suspicious Circumstances. Wawensmere Road, Wootton Wawen. Dark grey saloon seen to park on private driveway of house. Two males wearing balaclavas have then got out and approached the property. - *Suspicious Circumstances. Malthouse Lane, Earlswood. Man seen in the lane taking photos of cars parked on driveways.
