The death of the Duke of Edinburgh was an unexpected sadness and we all learnt things about his extraordinary

What an amazing life he led, with integrity and enthusiasm, love and loyalty to the Queen and the nation and a deep faith in God to sustain him through his many trials. Studley Isolation Support Group **update** May 2020 Edition 2

Now, more than ever, the community in our village are pulling together to support each other. The Studley Isolation Support Group supports all those who are isolated, alone, elderly or vulnerable. With Studley in Business and the Parish Council, we have built a core team of around 50 volunteers who carry out tasks on a daily basis. So far we have supported 165 households and undertaken over 1000 tasks. These range fromshopping, prescription collection to dog walking and daily newspaper deliveries.

Nothing is too much trouble for our volunteers, and we actively encourage anyone who is having to isolate, with no close family close by to help them, to give us a call on **07933 093268** from 9am to 5pm Monday to Saturday.

If you have a neighbour you are concerned about then please ask them to call us. Our aim is for everyone who is vulnerable to stay safely at home. No one who should be isolating needs to do any shopping, our volunteers are shopping ninjas!

We will be here for as long as necessary, and alongside our day to day tasks we can arrange for someone to call you for a chat, drop off some books or jigsaws, post letters etc. We are here for you.

Please note that we operate a password system to protect you. Please do not open the door to anyone you don't know, unless they can tell you the password that YOU have chosen. There are scammers capitalising on the current situation, and we want everyone to stay safe. Always follow the Government's Social Distancing guidelines

We are still looking for volunteers, please contact us if you are willing to help ...

Many volunteers are busy sewing scrubs, bags, headbands and facemasks. They are in need of new material (that can be washed at 60 deg), elastic & buttons about the size of a 2p. If you can help then please call the Isolation Support Group on 07933 093268. Arden Foodbank is working hard to supply food parcels to our community. Anyone who is struggling can request a voucher. Parcels can be collected from the Methodist Church on Tuesday afternoons, or one of the Isolation Support Group Volunteers can collect and deliver it for you. Nature jottings from Perrymill Lane

Although the weather this month has been unseasonably chilly, there have been some beautiful calm spring days to coax out the butterflies and encourage the birdsong.



22nd March. From the footbridge across the River Arrow at Coughton we noticed a couple of ducks in the water some distance upstream. One was distinctly black and white. Before I could get binoculars on them they took off, but Sue was quicker and could see the other bird had a distinctly brown head. The only conclusion then was that it was a pair of Goosanders – not a species we've ever seen before in the area. I contacted the county bird recorder who told me he was not surprised to hear this as birds have recently been seen between Bidford and Welford on the River Avon.

24th March. As we walked along Coughton Fields Lane beyond the ford we spotted an interesting plant growing in the verge. I used the "Seek" app on our phone and it informed me that the plant was Butterbur. I read that its name comes from the fact that in the past its large heartshaped leaves were used to wrap butter in warm weather. The song of Chiffchaffs could be heard for most of our walk to and from Coughton. A Brimstone butterfly was present in our garden.

25th March. We noticed many white and purple violets in Dark Lane, Astwood Bank.

27th March. We spotted two male Yellowhammers in Coughton Lane, Coughton.

 $\rm 29^{th}$ March. A Peacock butterfly was on the bridleway in Coughton Park wood.

30th March. Primroses seemed to be at their peak in the woodland. We were delighted to see a Hare in a field beside the wood. Peacock butterflies appeared in our garden today.



2nd April. On our walk along The Monarch's Way and through the woods we saw and stopped to listen to three Blackcaps singing in the bushes. Many Chiffchaffs were singing, and we watched one foraging amongst blackthorn blossom. We also had our first Orange Tip Butterfly sighting of the year. Many tadpoles were swimming in a large puddle in the woods.

 3^{rd} April. Two Siskins visited the sunflower hearts feeder in our garden. We spotted two Linnets in the hedgerow beside the footpath to Astwood Bank.

 7^{th} April. I noticed Cowslips in flower at the edge of the recreation ground. It would be interesting to know if these were self-seeded or part of recent plantings by parents and children.

13th April. We heard a Whitethroat singing near the ford at Coughton.

14th April. A Willow Warbler was singing in the woodland. Pete reported having seen House Martins over his Middletown Lane garden and Buzzards nesting in a tree nearby.

17th April. The early morning sunshine brought more butterflies out on the wing and we saw several Speckled Woods and a Green-veined White on our walk through the woods. A party of four Fallow Deer crossed the path ahead of us.





Visiting Coughton Court this spring

Over at Coughton Court our gardens and parkland are open for visitors to enjoy. Our shop is also now open, along with outdoor seating for our mini cafe. The house and our indoor seating are currently closed. The safety of our staff, volunteers and visitors from the nearby community remains our priority. We strongly advise booking your visits in advance, especially over school and bank holidays when we may be very busy. Please check the websites before your visit and follow government guidance on travel.

It's hard to beat that spring feeling, you can finally leave the house without a thick coat, feel the sun's warmth on your skin, enjoy the early-morning birdsong and stroll through fields of daffodils and shimmering bluebell woods. Spring brings warmer weather and longer days, so it's the perfect opportunity to take some time out and explore the great outdoors. Our orchards and hedgerows are currently at their blooming best,

and blossom from hawthorn and apple to ornamental cherries, can be found throughout April - June. The wisteria is also a beautiful sight, carefully pruned in winter in preparation for spring, the blooms appear from May or June in striking clouds of lilac against the house and in our walled garden which re-opened in April.

Spring is also the perfect time to stretch your legs on one of our walks. Come and experience the sights and sounds of the countryside, panoramic views, a range of wildlife, and the opportunity to learn about local history. Don't forget to pop to the café on your return for a well-deserved drink and tasty treat.
