A Message from Pat Newbold

Hello everybody - Happy New Year!

Well, 2020 will surely go down in the history of the world – and will surely stay in our memories for a very long time!

I wonder what personal memories will stay with you, what will you recount in the years to come to the children who come after you. I guess my accounts of countless Zoom calls, and my pathetic attempts to try to do sermons etc for the online service – I have given up!

But all of us will have witnessed, if not experienced, the fear, the disasters, the real suffering of those close to us who have lost livelihoods, jobs, homes, loved ones. These things stay in our hearts.

We will also have seen new relationships that have started and blossomed, endless kindnesses given and received, extra miles walked every day. We should write down our personal memories in a communal diary for posterity!

As the year ends and another year enfolds, and as we look into the great unknown, it is easy to imagine that chaos reigns....

But the gospels assure us that in this tiny baby in Bethlehem, our amazing God became man, a Light which will never be extinguished has come into the world: a Light which no darkness, however menacing, will be able to snuff out; a Light that beams into chaos, and if we have eyes to see it, creates order and beauty and illuminates our path.

It is so easy to become part of the darkness, and so to spread it, as our human eyes cannot see the end of the tunnel. But there is Light and Hope!

Hope can be a funny old wish-bone sort of word – hope it doesn't rain tomorrow, hope the A46 is clear, hope the Baggies win....

Studley Isolation Support Group **update** May 2020 Edition 2

Now, more than ever, the community in our village are pulling together to support each other. The Studley Isolation Support Group supports all those who are isolated, alone, elderly or vulnerable. With Studley in Business and the Parish Council, we have built a core team of around 50 volunteers who carry out tasks on a daily basis. So far we have supported 165 households and undertaken over 1000 tasks. These range fromshopping, prescription collection to dog walking and daily newspaper deliveries.

Nothing is too much trouble for our volunteers, and we actively encourage anyone who is having to isolate, with no close family close by to help them, to give us a call on **07933 093268** from 9am to 5pm Monday to Saturday.

If you have a neighbour you are concerned about then please ask them to call us. Our aim is for everyone who is vulnerable to stay safely at home. No one who should be isolating needs to do any shopping, our volunteers are shopping ninjas!

We will be here for as long as necessary, and alongside our day to day tasks we can arrange for someone to call you for a chat, drop off some books or jigsaws, post letters etc. We are here for you.

Please note that we operate a password system to protect you. Please do not open the door to anyone you don't know, unless they can tell you the password that YOU have chosen. There are scammers capitalising on the current situation, and we want everyone to stay safe. Always follow the Government's Social Distancing guidelines

Many volunteers are busy sewing scrubs, bags, headbands and facemasks. They are in need of new material (that can be washed at 60 deg), elastic & buttons about the size of a 2p. Nature jottings from Perrymill Lane

few weeks has meant that we've continued to keep to the surfaced



lanes. Walks have now taken us beyond the ford at Coughton and along Coughton Lane as far as the B4090. This has reminded us just how pleasant is the view over the open countryside towards and beyond Alcester from the top of the rise out of Coughton.

15th Nov. Our garden received two visits from a Sparrowhawk, neither of which ended in a meal for the bird.

 18^{th} Nov. Our early Christmas present to ourselves arrived – a moth trap, which I hope will enable me report on a different set of visitors to our garden next year.

19th Nov. We spotted a Little Egret near a Heron in a field off Sambourne Lane near Sambourne Park. This is the first one we've seen near the centre of the village.

21st Nov. Graham and Elizabeth have been enjoying seeing this Little Egret together with at least three Herons for the past week.

22nd Nov. A cormorant flew overhead by the ford at Coughton. In Wike Lane a couple of Fieldfares were perfectly illuminated by the low winter sun reminding us of just what attractive birds they are.

25th Nov. Two Pied Wagtails visited our garden. They've now become quite regulars.

26th Nov. The well-berried holly tree in our neighbour's garden is proving to be a great attraction to the local population of Redwings.

5th Dec. Redwings are still feeding on the holly berries next door. I put out a niger seed feeder for the first time for many months. Last time it took some time for the birds to show any interest, but two Goldfinches arrived to feed within hours.

Embryonic catkins are now visible to remind us that spring comes after winter. Buds are also becoming more noticeable in some trees and bushes.

12th Nov. We noticed a small flock of Meadow Pipits near a barn in Coughton Lane. A yellowhammer was perched in a nearby tree. As we walked back along Wike Lane the pheasant shoot was beginning. A short distance ahead of us a startled Muntjac appeared from the woodland and ran across the road but found that there was no gap in the fence. In a panic it whirled around, shot back across the road and disappeared into the woods. On our return home we noticed snowdrops in flower in the garden two houses from us.

15th Dec. In a field beside Coughton Lane we noticed a flock of at least fifty Redwings and a few Fieldfares feeding.

17th Dec. Pat Newbold spotted 2 adult and 2 young otters at Arrow Valley Lake, very exciting!



18th Dec. A lady who lives in Coughton Lane mentioned having occasional visits to her garden from a Lesser Spotted Woodpecker. These are now rare birds, so this is good news.

We may be closed over the winter but our conservation team are still hard at work carrying out the deep clean of the house ready for when we re-open in spring. During the closed months archive documents are photographed and filed, all of the brown wood furniture is dusted and museum wax is used to clean iron, steel, copper and brass which provides a protective seal for the next season.

By January we are deep into our annual clean and it's a really good time for the team to condition check each object in the collection. This includes checking the books in the Saloon which are susceptible to mould and waxing the floors which is a big job for the conservation team and their volunteers.

Our sister properties over at Baddesley Clinton and Packwood are open all year except Christmas Eve and Christmas Day. There's something magical about walking in winter, from hearing the frosty grass crunch underfoot to seeing low-lying mists sweeping across the countryside, the first months of the new year are the perfect time to wrap up warm, throw on some wellies and go for an invigorating walk. Blow away the cobwebs along blustery canal paths or take a frosty stroll across the Warwickshire countryside, now is the ideal time to get outside and enjoy the outdoors.

Over at Baddesley during January (whilst stocks last), join Peter Rabbit and his friends for some winter fun on a trail around the grounds. Peter Rabbit's friends need some help finding items to see them through the colder winter months. Young nature adventurers can lend a hand to some of Beatrix Potter's well-loved characters such as Squirrel Nutkin, Mr. Jeremy Fisher and Jemima Puddle-Duck, and solve the clues to earn their special trail badge and certificate. Booking on weekends is essential, the trail can be purchased upon arrival at the shop, £2 per trail.
