## A Letter from Rev. Adrian Guthrie

This is the second letter I have written for the April magazine as the first one didn't seem relevant any longer following the government and Church of England instructions in relation to the Coronavirus.

We find ourselves in a very difficult and unprecedented situation in much of the world, but with the possibility that it could bring us all closer together at a time when we are required to keep our distance from one another. We may not be able to meet together either in churches or in other places for a period of time, but through prayer and serving one another in new ways, we can draw closer to God and one another.

The Alcester Minster Church website will include links to helpful material to help our prayer life and other information, and so will our Facebook page and Twitter account. However, we plan to also provide communications in a paper form for those who are not internet users. This extended period of isolation might cause some people to feel lonely, so please ring one of the Ministry Leadership Team if you are anxious about anything or simply want to have a chat, or would like one of them to pray with you. The numbers are included on page 4 under Church Services

We also aware that there will be some people in our community who will not be able to earn a living during this period of shut-down and may find themselves without food for themselves or their family. The Arden Food Bank aims to be open as normal on Tuesdays and Fridays – please consult the website for details - arden.foodbank.org.uk.

Even though public worship is suspended for the time being, most of the churches of the minster will be open during the day for individual prayer, and I plan to circulate around the churches during this period to pray for world, country, parish and individual needs so that a rhythm of prayer is maintained in our churches and communities. We aim to leave some aids for prayer and other helpful resources and activities to help us continue to engage with God, and keep our faith and hope in him alive during these testing times.

Although we won't be able to remember Jesus' death or celebrate his resurrection in public worship this year, they remain the basis of our faith. Receiving Jesus' death on the cross personally as the only way our self-centredness can be forgiven, our consciences cleansed and a relationship with God redeemed, turns a very dark day into 'Good Friday'. And when Jesus rose again, he gave us the opportunity to turn the only certainty in our life (our death) from a negative to a positive – death can be transformed into eternal life as a result of Jesus' victory over the grave. 'Thine be the glory, risen conquering son!'

## Nature jottings from Perrymill Lane

The frequent and heavy rain this month have made the field footpaths so muddy that we've limited our walks to the lanes. However, wildlife continues to be active in the garden and hedgerows and the following sightings were recorded.

14<sup>th</sup> Feb. My attention was attracted by feathers floating down from an oak tree in our neighbours' garden. When viewed through binoculars the source seemed to be a Carrion Crow plucking and eating a Wood Pigeon in the tree.

21<sup>st</sup> Feb. We had a prolonged view of a Sparrowhawk sitting on our garden fence and were able to appreciate its lovely markings. Later, on a walk along Wike Lane, we saw a large mixed flock of Siskins and Lesser Redpolls feeding in the beech and larch trees.

26<sup>th</sup> Feb. A Little Owl could be heard calling across the field behind our house. Today I learned that the first Avocets of the year have arrived at Upton Warren.

 $29^{\rm th}$  Feb. As we drove just south of the Bidford Gliding Club we were please to see two kestrels hovering.

 $1^{st}$  March. Phil was please to report sightings from his early morning run along Middletown Lane. These included long-tailed Tits, Buzzards and deer.

2<sup>nd</sup> March. We noticed a large flock of Fieldfares, Redwings and Starlings in Wike Lane. A Little Owl was again calling close to the house.

2<sup>nd</sup> March. Peter reported several sightings in and around his Middletown Lane garden including a Bullfinch, Muntjacs, Tawny Owls and a Fox.

 $3^{rd}$  March. I was surprised to see a pair of Mallards waddling past the end of our rear garden – an indication of the amount of surface water around.

7<sup>th</sup> March. In a rare spell of pleasant weather, we took a 9:30am walk along Wike Lane and were entertained by bird song delivered by Song Thrushes, Chaffinches, Robins, Blackbirds and Great Tits. Wild garlic was growing well in the verges.

On a drive to Hampshire we saw more Red Kites than we've ever seen before on this journey, the first ones noted soon after Stow on the Wold with more in Oxfordshire. I'm used to seeing large numbers where the M40 crosses the Chilterns, but they seem to be spreading their range.

9<sup>th</sup> March. A flock of 100+ Fieldfares, Redwings and Starlings was moving between the grass and the trees, performing a "mini murmuration" in the Phil J 01527 892043 (12<sup>th</sup> March)
